Expressing emotions : co-read the story

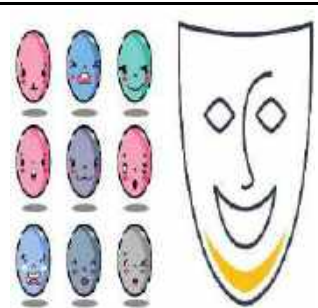
