After Chhutki's aeroplane was fixed, they all raced their aeroplanes and Chhutki's flew the farthest!










Nature elements

Chhutki found the following nature elements in the park. Tick the elements in the blank box given below you find in the park when you go for a walk and colour them.














Friendship
















Good behaviour
