With the help of an adult, cut along the dotted lines and separate the pictures of Japan's national and cultural symbols given below. Paste them in the right box.

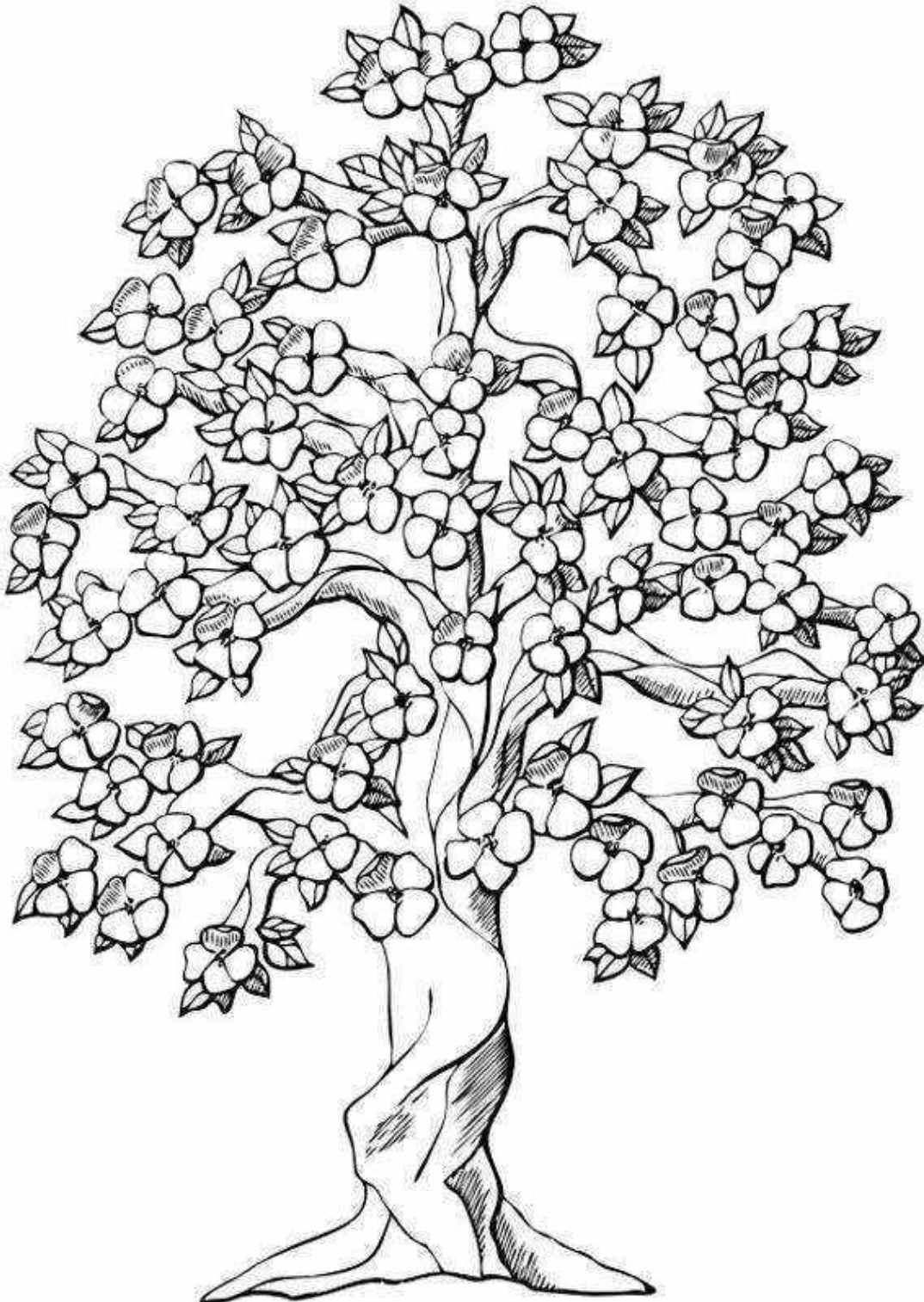
Sensu (fan)	Bonsai	Kimono (a dress)

Japan: Cherry blossom



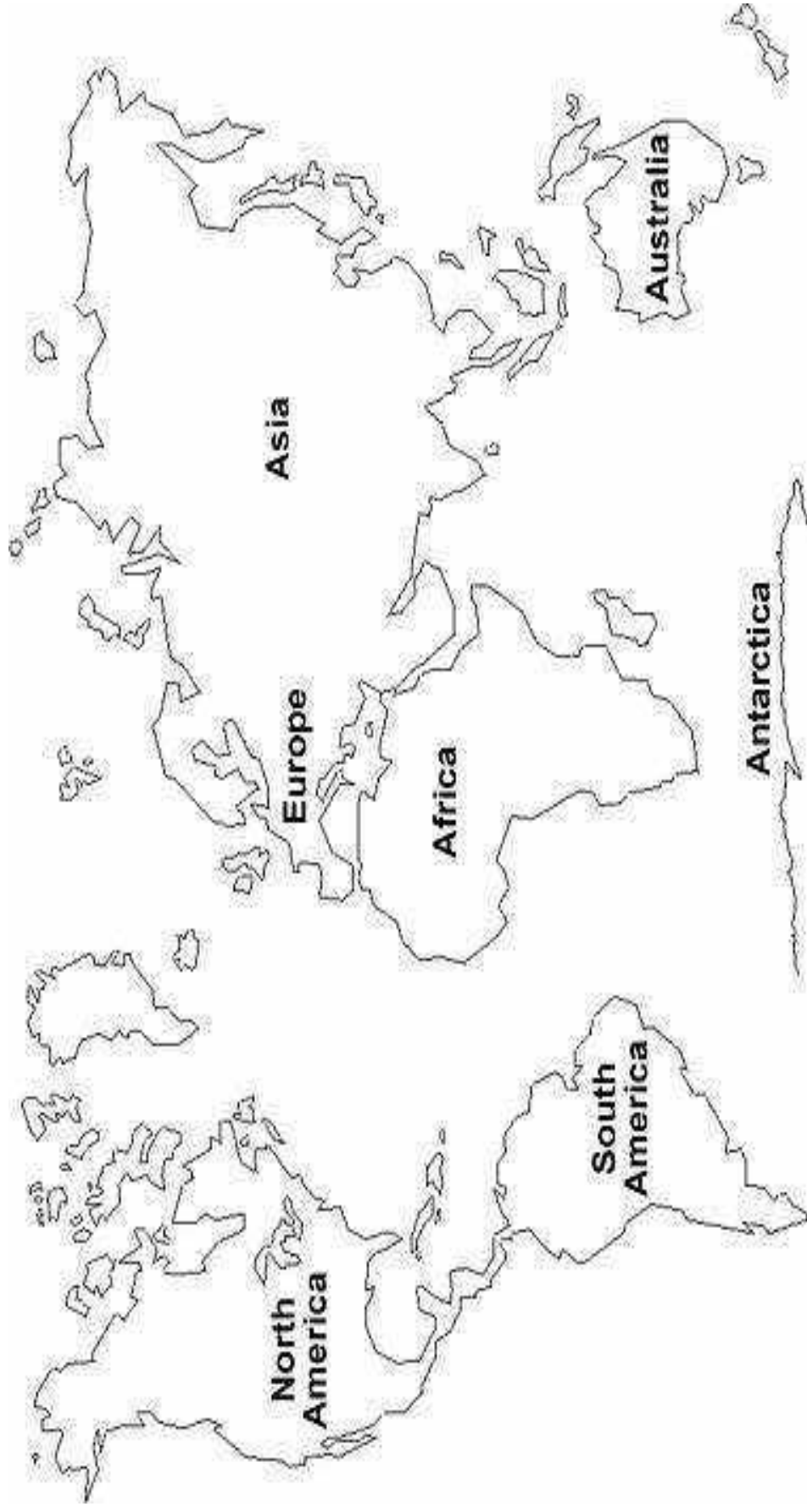
