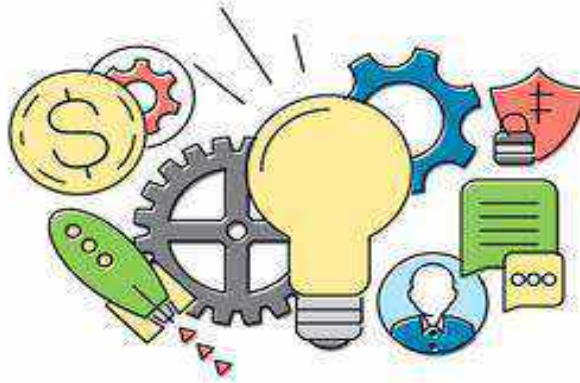

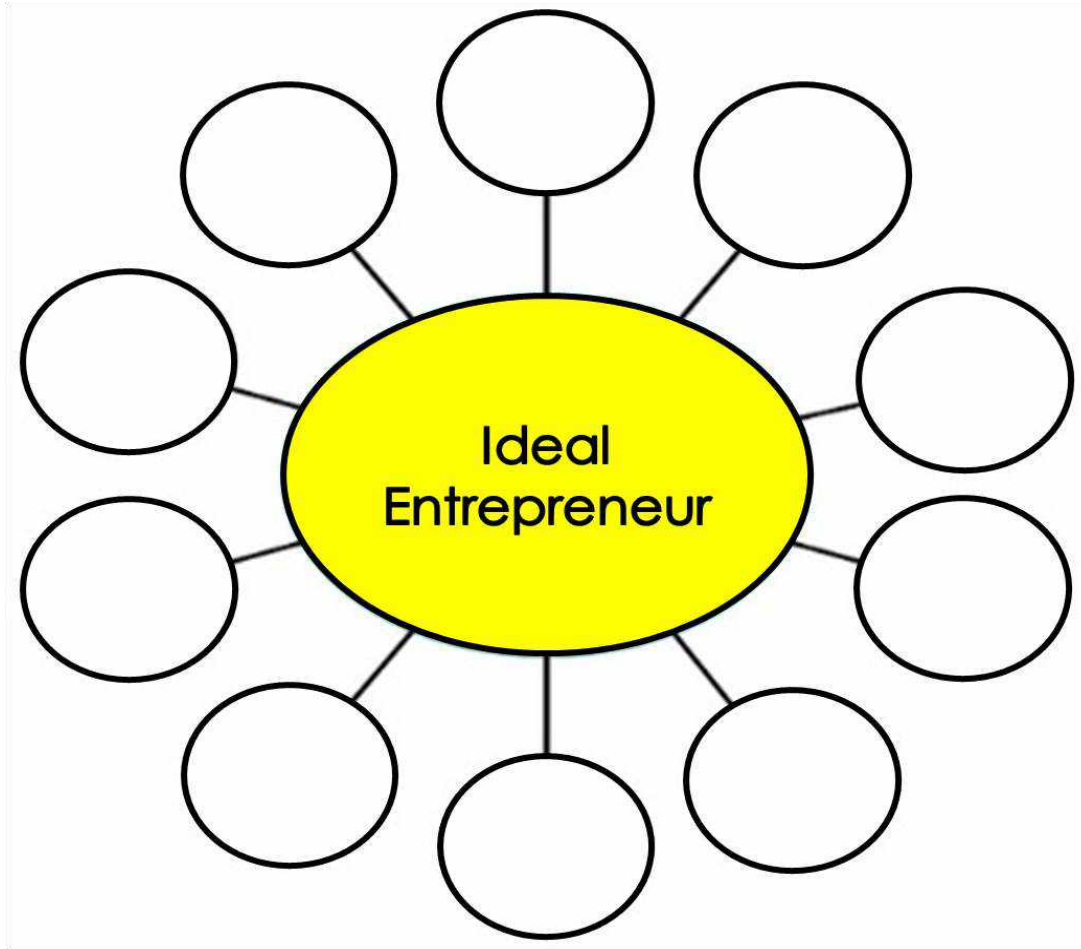

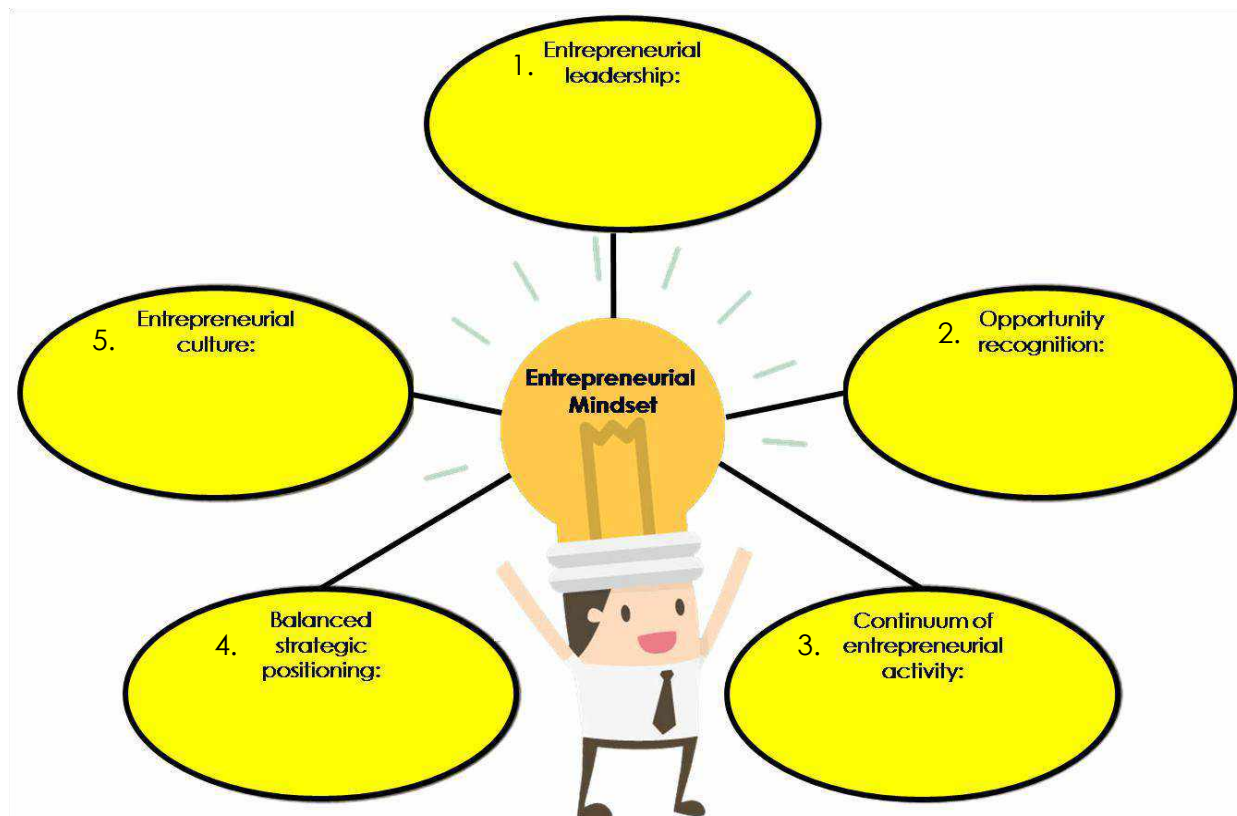
1. Having information, understanding, or skill that comes from experience or education.
